Tips

for Successful College Parenting

Starting college can be overwhelming. To help you, we have compiled a Task List of items your student needs to do once they have been admitted. They can access that in their myUSI portal by clicking on the Admitted Student Task List icon under Eagle Apps. Some of those tasks include:

- Meet with an advisor and register for classes
- Submit all required paperwork for financial assistance
- Fill out the University housing contract if your student will be living on campus
- Sign up for a meal plan
- Submit immunization paperwork
- Register vehicle with USI Public Safety
- Complete online training for Title IX
- Respond to Archie's Book Bundle email

Transition Issue – College is a big step for both students and parents; it may be the first time you've ever lived apart from one another. Here is a list of items to further prepare your student for their college experience and adjust to their growing independence.

- Learn to do laundry, clean and cook.
- Know how to perform basic maintenance on vehicle.
- Establish a monthly budget and discuss credit card use.
- Learn how to use an ATM and balance a checkbook.
- Provide your student their medical insurance card and explain how and when they use it.
- Obtain personal renter's insurance for student's belongings if not covered under family's homeowner's insurance.

Summer Session – High school graduates who have been admitted for the Fall but would like to start classes early should contact Undergraduate Admissions, 812-464-1765. First Summer begins May 13 and Second Summer begins June 24; a variety of course lengths may be offered during each Summer session.

This is the most significant transition in your student's life to date. It presents a great opportunity to express your pride, hope and trust in your student as they prepare to leave.




Transition Issues

- Help student decide which items they will take to college
- Learn who roommates will be and have your student make that first contact

Packing List – Remember most residents are sharing approximately 700 square feet with three other students. Consider the room size and that space is limited. We encourage students to pack lightly and purchase additional items after you move in. Walmart and grocery stores are conveniently located near campus. Also, we recommend that students wait until they move in to measure spaces as dimensions may vary slightly from building to building.

Your student may be both excited and anxious about starting college. Assisting them in being prepared for the transition will help calm some of the anxieties.

New Student Move-In – This is the big day and the University wants it to be as smooth a transition as possible. On this day students can pick up Welcome Week Information and check in for their campus housing, confirm meal plans, register their vehicle, etc.

Welcome Week – Welcome Week is the first taste of being a student at the University of Southern Indiana! It is a week full of activities and events designed to help new students meet other new students, get adjusted to new surroundings and start on the right foot in an academic career at USI. All new students are expected to attend New Student Convocation, all programs labeled “Eagle Experience” and are encouraged to attend as many other events as possible. New Student Convocation – This ceremony is held in August just before classes start. New students and their families are invited to attend this formal induction of new students to our academic community.

This is the time for students to evaluate how they are doing academically and make changes if needed. Encourage your student to meet with their advisor about classes and destress by reconnecting with old friends over fall break.

USI Live at the Apollo – A popular campus-wide event that showcases students using their talents in skits, songs, dance, instrumental numbers, monologues or other creative acts. Even if they are not performers, students are encouraged to attend this fun-filled event. USI Live at the Apollo is held every October.

Fall Festival – The first week of October the West Side Nut Club sponsors a mammoth Fall Festival. This is a week-long gala along Franklin Street with free entertainment, carnival attractions, window displays, scores of selling booths, amateur talent competitions and on the last day, a huge parade. This event, with many USI student organizations profiting, attracts over 150,000 people.

Priority Registration – The process of selecting courses before the semester begins. Once this is completed, students will have a seat reserved in the classes they've selected. The date students are eligible to register is based on the number of hours earned plus those currently enrolled. Priority registration occurs in October for Spring and Summer courses, and in March for Fall courses. Refer to the *Schedule of Classes* at USI.edu/registrar/registration for further details.

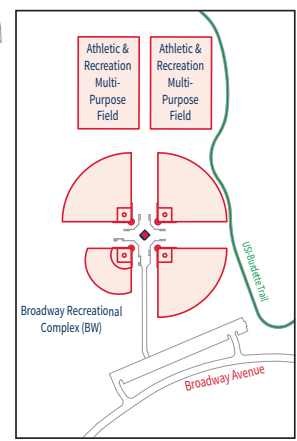
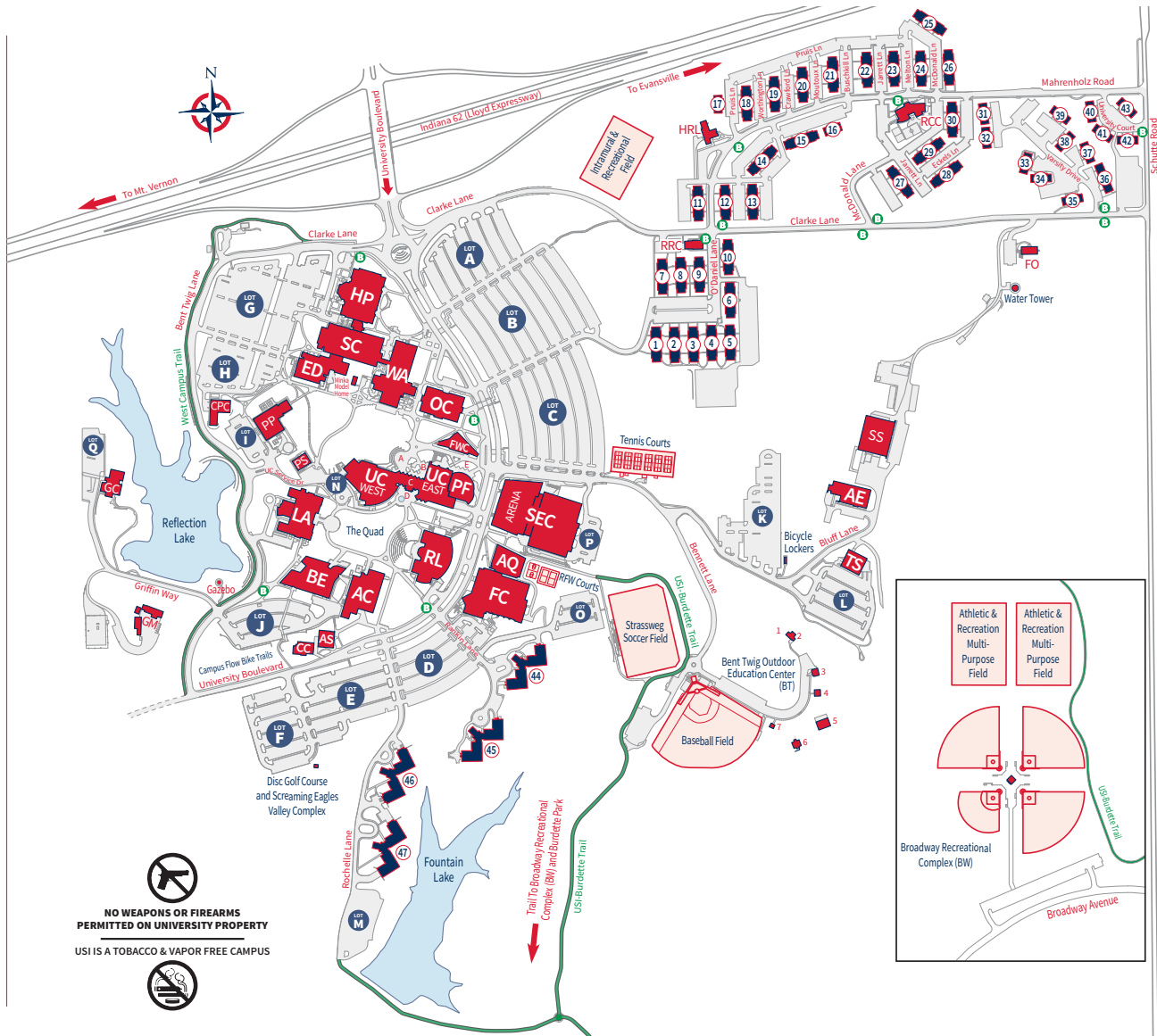
