# DISTINGUISHED ALUMNUS AND EVANSVILLE MAYOR FRANK McDONALD TO BRING COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS

Frank F. McDonald II '73, mayor of the City of Evansville, will bring the address in tonight's Commencement Exercises. He also will receive an honorary Doctor of Laws degree in recognition of his achievements in public service.

Mayor McDonald is serving his third elected term as mayor, with this term beginning in January 1996. He

originally took office in 1987, filling the unexpired term of Michael Vandeveer, who left office to enter business. At the time of his original appointment, he was an at-large member of the Evansville Common Council. Mayor McDonald also worked as city controller in 1983 and was a member of the Evansville Water and Sewer Utility Board of Directors from 1980-82.

Mayor McDonald's administration has been marked by fiscal conservatism in government and economic progress in the Evansville area. Mayor McDonald was one of several leaders who pressed for the creation of the Evansville Regional Economic Development Corporation, also known as Vision 2000, which has been a catalyst to attract new business and industry to the city and region. Between 1987 and 1998, the total number of jobs increased by 18,000 and Evansville now enjoys one of the state's lowest unemployment rates.

Mayor McDonald also concentrated on improving the city's infrastructure while reducing the cost of government. Roberts Municipal Stadium and the Victory Theatre have been renovated and a Downtown Learning Center, an innovative partnership between Evansville's public and parochial schools and its postsecondary institutions, has been

established in the Victory complex. He also oversaw development of the first complete renovation plan for the city's Dress Plaza. When riverboat gaming was approved for Evansville, Mayor McDonald conducted public hearings and presided over the selection process, resulting in \$17.3 million in economic incentives to the city from the licensed riverboat gaming operator.

In the past decade, the city's tax-supported debt has been reduced by 21 percent and the city's debt ratings have improved. Since 1992, Evansville residents have enjoyed lower property taxes through an eight percent Homestead Property Tax Credit. Mayor McDonald has operated city government with 24 percent fewer employees annually than in 1980, saving taxpayers \$12.5 million in personnel service costs. He also contracted for operation of city services through private enterprise, saving millions of dollars during the life of contracts to manage the water and sewer utilities, to provide ambulance services, and to manage Roberts Stadium, Mesker Music Theatre, and the Victory Theatre.

Mayor McDonald received the Bachelor of Science degree with a major in business management from the University of Southern Indiana in 1973. After graduating, he entered banking, working first at Merchants National Bank & Trust Company of Indianapolis. He returned to Evansville where he spent eight years as assistant vice president in the branch system, commercial lending, real estate, and marketing departments of National City Bank. Prior to assuming the mayor's office in 1987, Mayor McDonald was vice president and manager of the commercial loan department of People's Savings Bank. When Mayor McDonald leaves office at the end of his term this year, he will join Civitas Bank as senior vice president for commercial and governmental business development.

# EDWARD L. BRUNDICK JR. AND JAMES J. GIANCOLA TO BE RECOGNIZED

Honorary doctorates will be conferred on Evansville residents Edward L. Brundick Jr. and James J. Giancola in recognition of their accomplishments in their careers and their involvement in the University of Southern Indiana.

Mr. Giancola served as chair of Campaign USI, the University of Southern Indiana's successful capital campaign which produced \$24 million in current and deferred gifts. Completed in 1998, the two-and-a-half-year campaign involved 300 volunteers in four major divisions and exceeded all financial goals.

Mr. Giancola is president and chief executive officer of CNB Bancshares, a bank-based financial services company with operations in Indiana, Illinois, Kentucky, Michigan, and Tennessee. The company operates 144 banking offices, a consumer finance company, a leasing company, a credit life reinsurance company, and a broker/dealer and property casualty insurance agency that specializes in risk management, employee benefits, and personal insurance. CNB is the largest bank holding company with headquarters in Indiana.

Under Mr. Giancola's leadership, CNB has grown its assets to over \$7.1 billion at year end 1998. A significant portion of that growth occurred as a result of its acquisitions. Last April, Pinnacle Bank was acquired, the largest in CNB history, adding over \$2 billion in assets and 44 locations. Mr. Giancola has directed strategies to position the company to be successful in the long term with strong profitability in the short term. Last year the company produced record earnings —a 21 percent increase over the preceding year.

A graduate of Harvard University, Mr. Giancola has done postgraduate work at Suffolk University in Boston. He also has attended banking school at the University of Colorado. Mr. Giancola has 25 years of experience in banking and management consulting. He joined CNB in 1992 as executive vice president and in 1994 was promoted to president and chief operating officer. Prior to coming to Evansville, he was president of Gainer Bank in northern Indiana.

One of Mr. Giancola's principal interests is higher education. He has been a member of the Board of Directors of the USI Foundation since 1993 and has served as vice chair for development and vice chair for planning. He recently was appointed to the University of Evansville Board of Trustees. Active in the community, he has given leadership to the programs of United Way of Southwestern Indiana, Vision 2000, St. Mary's Hospital Foundation, Indiana Chamber of Commerce, and Right to Life.

Mr. Giancola will receive an honorary Doctor of Laws degree in tonight's ceremony.

For the past 25 years, Dr. Edward L. Brundick Jr. has been the team physician for the USI athletic program, furnishing medical care for athletes, dancers, and cheerleaders. A partner in Orthopaedic Associates of Evansville, Dr.

Brundick is one of Indiana's most respected orthopaedic surgeons.

Dr. Brundick came to Evansville in 1971 as a board certified orthopaedic surgeon. With the new national surge of interest in sports medicine, he was one of the first members of the American Orthopaedic Society for Sports Medicine. He was a founding member of the Indiana State Medical Association Sports Advisory Council and in 1996 served as president of the Indiana Orthopaedic Society. He has been chief of orthopaedic surgery and chief of medical staff at Deaconess Hospital, served on the Deaconess Board of Directors, and was the founding chairman of the Board of Directors of Physicians Health Plan. He practices with the Orthopaedic Associates group in Evansville. Active in professional organizations, he has served on committees for the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons and the American Academy of Surgeons. In 1998, Dr. Brundick was chosen by the Indiana State Medical Association as "Team Physician of the Year."

A native of Missouri, Dr. Brundick attended Central Missouri State College and graduated from the University of Kansas with a major in zoology. A gifted athlete, he played basketball, baseball, and was a member of the track team. After graduation, he signed a contract to play professional baseball with the Baltimore Orioles in its minor league system. At his parents' urging, he set his sights on graduate school and was accepted to law school, dentistry school, and medical school. He chose dentistry, but switched to medicine after two semesters. He earned the Doctor of Medicine degree from University of Missouri in 1961.

Soon afterward, Dr. Brundick entered the U.S. Air Force, serving until 1971, and was first assigned to Cape Canaveral where he provided medical support to personnel involved in the emerging space program. He completed an orthopaedic residency in Denver in 1968, and was named one of five "Outstanding Orthopaedic Residents" in the United States by the American Orthopaedic Association. From 1968-71, he was assigned to the air base at Bitburg, Germany, during the VietnamWar. At the conclusion of his tour of duty in 1971, Dr. Brundick, who had attained the rank of Lt. Colonel, was discharged honorably and awarded the Air Force Commendation Medal for Meritorious Service.

# OSCAR OZETE AND MARYBETH CABLE WILL RECEIVE UNIVERSITY'S HIGHEST HONORS

The University's highest honors will be awarded during tonight's ceremony to Dr. Oscar Ozete, professor of Spanish, and to MaryBeth Cable, a senior communications major from Crown Point, Indiana.

Dr. Ozete was chosen by his colleagues to receive the National City Bank Distinguished Professor Award. The award is made possible by a generous gift from National City Bank of Evansville.

Dr. Ozete holds the Doctor of Philosophy and Master of Arts in Teaching degrees from Indiana University. His undergraduate work was completed at University of Miami. Dr. Ozete joined the faculty of the University of Southern Indiana in 1980 and from 1982 to 1996, he was chair of the Department of Foreign Languages. Dr. Ozete has directed study programs in Mexico for USI, Indiana University, and Rotary International. He also has been a visiting professor of language and linguistics at Purdue University and has taught and been a program coordinator at University of Wisconsin-Madison. Before entering university work, Dr. Ozete taught Spanish, English as a Second Language, and Russian for the Dade County (Miami, Florida) public schools. His nominator said of him, "Above all, Dr. Ozete is a consummate teacher. I have observed him and marveled at his originality, his versatility, and his enthusiasm. After 35 years of full-time university service, there is an effervescence in his teaching and professional life that is truly rare." Letters of support also came from several of Dr. Ozete's former students who spoke not only of his dedication to teaching, but also of the "life changing" educational experiences he encouraged them to undertake.

Dr. Ozete is widely known for his successful textbooks for students of Spanish. His college textbook, Contigo, is in its third edition. He has completed a new text for first-year students, ¡Saludos!, and is at work on a second-year text, Recuredos. Dr. Ozete also has written the grammar portion of Holt Reinhart's high school text used in thousands of high school classrooms nationwide.

In 1996 Dr. Ozete was named Outstanding Spanish Professor of the Year for Indiana. The same year, he received the Nelson Brooks Award for Excellence in the Teaching of Culture at the national conference of the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages. The Brooks Award is a distinction awarded to only one foreign language professor or teacher nationally in any field of modern foreign languages.

As Distinguished Professor, Dr. Ozete will receive a grant from National City Bank, select a student to receive a scholarship in his name, and deliver the Distinguished Professor Lecture during the next academic year.







MaryBeth Cable

The Student Academic Affairs Committee of the Faculty Senate selected MaryBeth Cable as this year's recipient of the President's Medal. She was chosen because of her commitment to academic excellence and her service to the University and the community. One of her professors said of her, "I have always found her to demonstrate the highest character in terms of integrity, honesty, professionalism, and maturity."

Miss Cable has been active in the Student Government Association, chairing several committees and projects, and culminating with a year as executive vice president. She also has given leadership to several projects of the Student Alumni Association, Student Housing Association, Activities Programming Board, and the USI chapter of the Public Relations Student Society of America. Miss Cable has assisted the University through work as a member of the Student Publications Committee, Volunteer USI Committee, Student Ambassadors, AMIGO orientation staff, Connections staff, and as a math tutor in the Academic Skills program.

In recognition of her superior academic and service record, she was named to Alpha Chi Honorary Society and Golden Key Honor Society. She consistently has been a Dean's List student and has expanded her academic preparation in public relations through internships at *The Evansville Courier & Press* and Whirlpool Corporation. Her honors include Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges, Student Government Association's 1997-98 Most Dedicated Member, and 1996-97 Member of the Year. Miss Cable was a finalist in 1995 for appointment as student representative on the Indiana Commission for Higher Education.

Miss Cable is the daughter of Rod and Paulette Cable of Crown Point. She plans to pursue a career in public relations following graduation.

## Presidential Medallion

During the Middle Ages, medallions signified membership in religious orders and guilds and, in the Renaissance, membership in elite orders of knighthood and prominence in government office. Today, colleges and universities strike medallions to commemorate important events and achievements. The University of Southern Indiana Presidential Medallion signifies the authority invested in the president.

Fabricated in bronze, the Presidential Medallion celebrates the 1995 inauguration of President H. Ray Hoops. At its center the bronze medallion bears a three-inch reproduction of the University seal, surrounded by a half-inch rim; on the back of the medallion are the names and dates of appointment of the University's presidents. During tonight's ceremony, a replica of the Presidential Medallion will be presented to MaryBeth Cable. This is the highest honor given to a graduating senior.

# University Seal

The University seal bears the University's colors—red, white, and blue —with gold. The shield signifies the importance of higher education in defending citizens against ignorance. Between the two banners carrying the University's name appear a band and an open book bound together by the torch of knowledge. In the band, rays of light emanate simultaneously from a rising sun, symbolizing the young University, and from the torch, symbolizing the light of knowledge and the passion for scholarship. Trees on either side of the flame suggest not only the University's pastoral southern Indiana setting but also life, growth, continuity.

Beneath this band, an open book emphasizes the importance of teaching and learning; *academia populi* and *academia populo* indicate that the University of Southern Indiana is a scholarly academy founded and supported by the people, for the people. Finally, the laurel branches to the right and left of the book represent victory: the light of learning overcomes the darkness of ignorance.

# University Mace

In the Middle Ages, bodyguards of French and English monarchs carried ceremonial maces.

Later, the mace became an important symbol of office in civil processions and academic pageantry; at the University of Southern Indiana, the Grand Marshal, a distinguished member of the faculty, carries the mace.

A replica of the walking cane of Richard Owen (1810-1890) serves as the centerpiece of the University mace. A respected geologist and professor of natural science at Indiana University, Owen became the first president of Purdue University. He was a son of Robert Owen (1771-1858), the Welsh industrialist who established New Harmony, Indiana, as a center for education and enlightened social reform in the early 1800s. The 32inch-tall, wooden cane was presented to Richard Owen in 1874 and, through the generosity of his descendant Kenneth D. Owen, served as the Grand Marshal's staff until the mace was fabricated for the University's first Presidential Inauguration in 1995.

Designed and fabricated by Nicholas Logsdon of Indianapolis, the University mace encloses a replica of the Owen cane and is gold-plated. At the top, above the cane's golden head, an open orb holds a replica of the University seal. The free-flowing design of the orb symbolizes the interrelationships among all academic disciplines. Below the cane's tip are three golden rings engraved with the names and

appointment dates of the University presidents. A finial at the tip of the cane bears the names of Kenneth Dale Owen and Jane Blaffer Owen, donors of the mace.

Designed and created by alumnus Kenny Fisher '77, the replica of the cane and the base are made of walnut from the Owen mansion built in New Harmony during the 1830s.

# University History

The University of Southern Indiana first held classes on September 15, 1965. Born of community need and nurtured by community leaders, the University has enjoyed a breadth and depth of community support rare for such institutions. In 1967, Southern Indiana Higher Education, Inc. (SIHE), raised nearly \$1 million to acquire 1,400 acres for the Mid-America University Center, and gave 300 acres for the development of the USI campus. Groundbreaking occurred June 22, 1968, initiating the first phase of campus construction. From modest beginnings in the former Centennial School building, the campus moved in 1969 to its current site.

The first phase of the architectural master plan provided the Physical Activities Center, Rice Library, Science Center, Technology Center, University Center, and Wright Administration Building. The Robert D. Orr Center opened in 1990 and the Health Professions Center opened in 1995. A major expansion of the University Center was completed in 1997. A new \$15.8 million Liberal Arts Center is under construction and expected to open in fall 1999. To meet a need for on-campus housing, SIHE built student-housing units adjacent to the USI campus. This complex, originally called Mid-America Student Housing, opened in 1984. Today the complex comprises two sites, the Frank F. McDonald Apartments and Joseph E. O'Daniel Apartments, and is home to more than 2,500 students.

Originally established as a regional campus of Indiana State University, the University of Southern Indiana became a separate state university by act of the 1985 Indiana General Assembly. Governor Robert D. Orr appointed a board of trustees, and the establishment of the University of Southern Indiana became official on July 1, 1985.

Beginning in 1965 with a freshman class of 412 students, 2 full-time faculty, 32 part-time or adjunct instructors, and a staff of 38, the University has grown to enroll over 8,400 students with 420 full-time faculty and administrators, 215 part-time faculty, 417 clerical, hourly, and support staff, and 650 student employees. Students study toward associate and baccalaureate degrees in more than 60 majors and toward master's degrees in seven fields

In addition to its campus programs, USI has articulation agreements with Ivy Tech State College and Vincennes University, cooperates with regional hospitals in providing health-professions programs, and holds classes in many off-campus sites. Through Historic New Harmony, the Historic Southern Indiana Project, the Tri-State World Trade Council, the Management Diagnostic Center, theatrical productions in New Harmony and Lincoln State Park, and credit and noncredit classes, the University influences intellectual, cultural, social, and commercial development throughout southern Indiana.

#### Academic Dress

The academic costume dates from medieval days when university students wore woolen and fur garments for warmth in damp and drafty buildings. Most of those studying were clerics in holy orders; they wore a cloak to which was attached a hood that could be pulled up to cover their tonsured heads. Simplified today, the costume

serves to remind us that its wearer is a member of an ancient and venerable profession; it also indicates by its color and design the wearer's degree and the institution by which the degree was conferred.

In the United States, black has been the traditional color for academic gowns, but some institutions authorize holders of their doctorates to wear colors of the institution. The bachelor's gown is distinguished by its long, open sleeves; the master's by its closed, slitted sleeves; the doctor's by its full sleeves trimmed with bands of velvet, which may be black or a color denoting the field in which the degree was taken.

The mortarboard cap, proper for all degrees, is black. Tassels, usually black, are worn over the left front quarter of the cap. Holders of the doctorate may wear tassels of gold thread.

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree attained and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. The honorary doctoral hoods of the University of Southern Indiana are black, lined with blue satin with red satin chevrons. They are edged with white velvet.

### Alumni Association Pins

Graduates in tonight's ceremony are receiving lapel pins with the University logo as a gift of the University of Southern Indiana Alumni Association.

# Baccalaureate Scholarship Honors

The baccalaureate degree candidate graduating with the highest scholarship index is graduated *summa cum laude*. Baccalaureate students graduating with a scholarship index of 3.80 or higher are graduated *magna cum laude*. Those with a scholarship index between 3.60 and 3.80 are

graduated *cum laude*. These achievements are set forth on the individual diplomas. Honor students can be recognized in the Commencement Exercises by colored stoles and tassels. Gold indicates *summa cum laude*; red, *magna cum laude*; and blue, *cum laude*.

Because students enrolled in master's degree programs are expected to maintain a minimum grade-point average of 3.0, and most achieve much higher levels, scholarship honors at Commencement are given only to baccalaureate students.

# Photography During Ceremony

A commercial photographer is taking photographs of each graduate as he/she shakes hands with the President. Each graduate will receive a proof from which duplicates can be ordered. Family members who wish to take still or video photographs during the ceremony are asked to use the restricted area on the floor. Security guards will ask those who block aisles in the stands or occupy the area behind the stage to move. Your cooperation ensures the dignity of the Commencement ceremony.
