James T. Morris, President of Lilly Endowment, Will Bring Commencement Address

The Commencement Address today will be brought by James T. Morris, president of Lilly Endowment, Inc. Mr. Morris joined the Indianapolis philanthropy as a director of community development programs in 1973. He was named vice president for community development in 1977, executive vice president in 1983, and president in 1984. Before joining the Endowment, he worked for six years as administrative assistant and chief of staff for Richard Lugar, who was then mayor of Indianapolis.

Through his work in community development, Mr. Morris has helped formulate plans and projects for the revitalization of Indianapolis. He also has an abiding interest in creating opportunities for youth and providing quality education in Indiana. In 1986, he announced that the Endowment would step up its efforts to improve education throughout the state. Since then, the Endowment has launched a series of statewide grants, including the largest grant program in Endowment history — a \$50-million scholarship fund for Indiana residents attending private and public colleges and universities in Indiana.

A native of Terre Haute, Indiana, Mr. Morris was graduated from Garfield High School. He earned a bachelor's degree in political science from Indiana University in 1965, and a master's degree in business administration from Butler University in 1970.

Mr. Morris is an elder of the Second Presbyterian Church and is secretary of the church's endowment fund. He serves on the board of directors of United Way of Central Indiana, Indianapolis Convention and Visitors Association, and Indianapolis Chamber of Commerce. For eight years, he served on the Board of Trustees of Indiana State University and was board chairman for two years. He also was chairman of the Marion County Health and Hospital Corporation for eight years. Mr. Morris also is a board member of American United Life Insurance Company, MSA Realty Corporation, and the Hugh J. Baker Company.

Elected to the Executive Board of the U.S. Olympic Committee in 1984, Mr. Morris led the most successful fund-raising effort, on a per capita basis, of any state committee in the nation. He currently serves on the executive committee for the Pan American Games to be held in Indianapolis this summer.

In 1970-71, Mr. Morris was a member of the U.S. delegation to NATO's Committee on the Challenges of Modern Society. In 1972, he was named "Outstanding Young Man in Indianapolis" and in 1973, was honored as one of five "Outstanding Young Hoosiers." He has received honorary degrees from Butler, Indiana State, and Vincennes universities. In addition, Mr. Morris was honored in 1986 with the "Distinguished Alumni" award by Butler University, and with the "Distinguished Eagle Scout" award by the National Council of Boy Scouts.

Mr. Morris and his wife, the former Jacqueline Harrell of Bloomington, are the parents of three children, John Timothy, 20; Jeffrey Todd, 16; and Jennifer Lynn, 12.

Mr. Morris will be recognized for his achievements on behalf of excellence in education. He will receive a Doctor of Laws degree in today's ceremony.

Gail Lumet Buckley Will be Recognized For For Literary Achievement

Gail Lumet Buckley is the author of *The Hornes: An American Family*. Her book tells the story of her forebears, some who lived in Evansville, and includes a glimpse into the life of her mother, famed singer Lena Horne, who became the first black movie star of international acclaim. *The Hornes* is a loving memoir that not only reflects well on those the author loves, but also relates a strictly American story as only Ms. Buckley could tell it.

Ms. Buckley spent three years researching and two years writing the book in which she examines her life in view of her heritage. Careful attention was paid to the social and historical context surrounding the various periods of her ancestors, one of whom was Mr. Edwin Horne, her great-grandfather, who grew up in Evansville. He was a correspondent for The Evansville Journal, a daily newspaper and forerunner of The Evansville Courier, and later moved to New York City, where he spent much time raising his granddaughter, Lena, after her parents were divorced.

Ms. Buckley was born in 1937 in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, the first child of Louis Jones and his Brooklyn-born wife, Lena. Mr. Jones was a politician who later went into magazine publishing. The couple also had a son before the marriage ended and Lena Jones resumed her maiden name and career. Ms. Buckley moved to Hollywood with her mother, living there from 1941 to 1947. She later attended a private school in New York City, a Quaker boarding school in upstate New York, and Radcliffe College, where she earned a degree in French. Her academic preparation won her a position with Marie-Claire magazine in Paris, where she moved in 1959. She and film director Sidney Lumet were married in 1963, had two daughters, and were divorced in 1977. She now is married to editor Kevin Buckley. With the exception of her brief employment at Marie-Claire, a 1963 stint at Life magazine, a brief period in advertising, and one off-Broadway production, her attention has been focused on her home. With *The Hornes*, she enters the highly visible world of the successful writer. She considers it just the beginning, because "There's so much that had to be cut, I may be able to make another book out of that material alone."

Ms. Buckley will be recognized for her contribution to American literature through a work that touches on the history of Evansville in this 175th anniversary year of the Ohio River city. She will receive a Doctor of Letters degree in today's ceremony.



Kenneth Dale Owen's Contribution to Geology and Historic Preservation to be Recognized

A Doctor of Science degree will be conferred on Kenneth Dale Owen, who was born in New Harmony in 1903, the son of Lucille Eagle, granddaughter of Pierre Duclos, and Richard Dale Owen, great-grandson of Robert Owen, who established an intellectural and utopian community in New Harmony in 1824. Mr. "K. D." Owen spent some of his early youth in California, but returned to New Harmony where he swam in the Wabash, roamed the hills of Posey County, and attended the New Harmony public schools. He attended high school in Memphis, Tennessee, where he excelled in both academic and athletic pursuits.

Mr. Owen earned an A. B. degree in geology at Cornell University and worked as a field geologist in Texas during the 1920s, when the oil industry was beginning to use scientific tools in exploration. He worked for Humble Oil and a subsidiary of Standard Oil Company of Indiana before working with independent oil producers. In the late twenties and early thirties, he had the opportunity to acquire oil leases of his own and to prepare to build his own business as a consulting geologist. By combining his expertise with that of two geophysicists, he was able to discover a highly productive oil field that became the financial basis for his formation of two successful companies, Gulfshore Oil Company and Trans-Tex Production Company. Mr. Owen still maintains his business office in Houston, the city where he first opened an office as a consulting geologist.

Mr. Owen and his wife, the former Miss Jane Blaffer of Houston, were married in the 1930s and had three daughters. Both Mr. and Mrs. Owen have retained an active interest in the restoration and preservation of properties in New Harmony, where he is vice chairman of the New Harmony Commission. He also is one of the seven founding members of the New Lanark Association, Ltd., in Scotland, an organization restoring the original Owen industrial properties which Robert Owen left when he came to America and New Harmony in 1924.

Mr. Owen developed an internationally recognized herd of purebred hereford cattle at Indian Mound Farm at New Harmony and presently is continuing the breeding of stardardbred horses at Oxford Hill Farm in Pennsylvania. He is a member of the Equine Advisory Council of the New York State College of Veterinary Medicine and a director of the Hambletonian Society. He is a member of various petroleum organizations and an emeritus member of the Cornell University Council and a member of the New York Alpha Chapter of Phi Kappa Psi.

Academic Dress

The academic costume dates from medieval days when university students wore woolen and fur garments for warmth in damp and drafty buildings. Most of those studying were clerics in the holy orders; they wore a cloak to which was attached a hood that could be pulled up to cover their tonsured heads. Simplified today, the costume serves to remind us that its wearer is a member of an ancient and venerable profession; it also indicates by its color and design its wearer's degree and its institution by which the degree was conferred.

In the United States, black has been the traditional color for academic gowns, but some institutions authorize holders of their doctorates to wear colors of the institution. The bachelor's gown is distinguished by its long, open sleeves; the master's by its closed, slitted sleeves; the doctor's by its full sleeves trimmed with bands of velvet, which may be black or a color denoting the field in which the degree was taken.

The mortarboard cap, proper for all degrees, is black. Tassels, usually black, are worn over the left front quarter of the cap. Holders of the doctorate may wear tassels of gold thread.

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. The honorary doctoral hoods of the University of Southern Indiana are black, lined with blue satin with red satin chevrons. They are edged with white velvet.

The Mace of the University

In medieval England, the mace was a formidable weapon, held ready by a bodyguard who led the way for dignitaries or officers of the court. From the sixteenth century in England and since colonial days in America, the mace has become a symbol of office only, and is carried by a distinguished member of the faculty who leads the Commencement processional. Here, it is carried by the Grand Marshal.

The University's official Mace is the cane of Richard Owen, who was a geologist and professor of natural science at Indiana University before becoming the first president of Purdue University. He was the great-grandfather of Kenneth Dale Owen, who will receive an honorary doctorate degree in today's ceremony. A respected scientist and scholar, Richard was a son of Robert Owen, the Scottish industrialist who established New Harmony, Indiana, as a center for education and enlightened social reform in the early 1800s. All the children of Robert Owen who accompanied him to America made far-reaching contributions to society, and helped to shape the governmental, social, and cultural directions of the state, region, and nation.

Scholarship Honors

The student graduating with the highest scholarship index will be graduated summa cum laude. Students graduating with a scholarship index of 3.80 or higher will be graduated magna cum laude. Those with a scholarship index between 3.60 and 3.80 will be graduated cum laude. These achievements are set forth on the individual diplomas. Honor students can be recognized in the commencement exercises by the colored stoles and tassels. Gold indicates summa cum laude; red, magna cum laude; and blue, cum laude.
