### William R. Burleigh to Deliver Address

The Commencement address today will be delivered by William R. Burleigh, Editor of the *Cincinnati Post* and an Evansville native who has distinguished himself as a journalist and civic leader.

Burleigh began his journalist career in high school as a part-time sports reporter for the *Evansville Press*. He attended Marquette University in Milwaukee where he majored in journalism and received his degree magna cum laude. He was editor of the university newspaper and was named outstanding graduate in journalism by Sigma Delta Chi honorary journalism society.

Following graduation from college and service in the U.S. Infantry, he returned to his hometown and accepted a position with the Press as a general assignment reporter, specializing in education and labor news. Burleigh further advanced his career as he covered some of the early school integration conflicts in the South in the late 1950s. He became the first urban affairs reporter of the Press and was also assigned to cover the Indiana General Assembly. In 1960, he was promoted to Assistant City Editor and advanced to City Editor two years later. In 1969, he was named Managing Editor of the Press, a position he held until 1975 when he was named Editor and President of the Press. In July, 1977, Burleigh became Editor of the Cincinnati Post.

Throughout his career, Burleigh has been recognized by professional journalistic organizations for his work. His editorial writing has won awards from the Hoosier State Press Association, the Press Club of Evansville, and United Press International. While he was City Editor, the *Press* was honored by the Hoosier Press



Association for having the best local news coverage among Indiana dailies. He has also been honored by his alma mater, Marquette University, as the recipient of the By-Line Award given to alumni who have distinguished themselves in the communications field.

Burleigh has been a leader in professional and civic organizations. Among his professional activities are membership in Sigma Delta Chi, the Cincinnati Literary Club, Alpha Sigma Nu national honorary society, and the American Society of Newspaper Editors.

He was one of the founding members of Leadership Evansville and took that expertise to Cincinnati where he has assumed the chairmanship of the steering committee of Leadership Cincinnati. While living in the Evansville area, he was a member of the Board of Directors and Executive Committee of United Way of Southwestern Indiana and chaired the Newburgh division of the United Way campaign in 1974 and 1975. He has extended his interest in United Way to Cincinnati where he is director of the Cincinnati United Appeal.

Burleigh and his wife Anne have three children.

### Edwin Donald Elliott

Edwin Donald Elliott, Vice President for Personnel at Mead Johnson & Company, has been a part of the tremendous growth of that company in his 26 years of service there.

The Evansville community has also benefited from Elliott's energies and talents. He has extended his leadership capabilities to a wide-ranging group of professional, philanthropic, and civic organizations. # William Lee Hitch

A native of Princeton, Indiana, William Lee Hitch is a loyal alumnus of Indiana State University.

Hitch graduated from ISU in 1944 with a Bachelor of Science degree. A varsity basketball player, Hitch was recipient of the Gillum Award as outstanding athlete and was chosen All-State Guard by the *Indianapolis Star* in 1943. Following graduation, he served as a naval officer during World War II.

Today Hitch is President of Hitch Packing Company in Princeton. He is a past president of the Buffalo Trace Boy Scout Council and has sponsored Little League, Pony League, and Babe Ruth teams for the past 30 years. His generosity has enabled underprivileged boys to attend summer camp, and deserving ISU students benefit from his contributions.

A member of the ISU Board of Trustees for two terms from 1969 to 1977, he held several offices on the Board, including president. He currently serves on the Board of Directors of the ISUE Foundation and the Gibson County Bank, and is President of the Indiana State Meat Packers Association.

He and his wife Phyllis are the parents of two grown children.

John and Josephine Elliott are dedicated citizens of New Harmony whose efforts have helped to preserve that city's unique past.

Both Mr. and Mrs. Elliott have been active in Harmonie Associates, the Golden Raintree Association, and the New Harmony Workingmen's Institute. They also served as consultants for a documentary film on New Harmony and helped to coordinate the Robert Owen Bicentennial Conference in 1971.

John Bennett Elliott is owner and operator of Elliott Farms. An adjunct instructor of anthropology and archaeology at Indiana State University Evansville, he has directed ISUE's archaeological field school in New Harmony for the past five years. Mr. Elliott studied at the University of Chicago, receiving the Ph.B in anthropology and undertaking graduate work there in that field before going to the University of Illinois to study agriculture.

Josephine Mirabella Elliott is a former teacher whose interest, in recent years, has turned to historical research and writing. As ISUE's first Archivist, she established the university archives and a department of special collections. Her primary interest is historical research of New Harmony and Posey County, much of which is invaluable in the preservation of New Harmony's heritage.

She has authored several articles and publications on New Harmony and currently is working on two illustrated histories and a publication for the New Harmony Commission. Mr. Elliott also is a writer, having written and edited articles on history and archaeology.

Even with the amount of time they have given to their New Harmony projects, they have found time to extend their energies to many professional and civic organizations. Mrs. Elliott's memberships include the Indiana and American Society of Archivists, National Historic Communal Societies Association, and Indiana Oral History Roundtable. Mr. Elliott is a member of the Society for American Archaeology, Wabash Valley Archaeological Society, New Harmony Memorial Commission, New Harmony Plan Commission, Harmonie Ahead, Inc., and Gresham Creek Watershed Conservancy group.

### Academic Dress

The academic costume dates from medieval days when university students wore woolen and fur garments for warmth in damp and drafty buildings. Most of those studying were clerics in the holy orders; they wore a cloak to which was attached a hood that could be pulled up to cover their tonsured heads. Simplified today, the costume serves to remind us that its wearer is a member of an ancient and venerable profession; it also indicates by its color and design its wearer's degree and the institution by which the degree was conferred.

In the United States, black has been the traditional color for academic gowns, but some institutions authorize holders of their doctorates to wear colors of the institution. The bachelor's gown is distinguished by its

long, open sleeves; the master's by its closed, slitted sleeves; the doctor's by its full sleeves trimmed with bands of velvet, which may be black or a color denoting the field in which the degree was taken.

The mortarboard cap, proper for all degrees, is black. Tassels, usually black, are worn over the left front quarter of the cap. Holders of the doctorate may wear tassels of gold thread.

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. The honorary doctoral hoods of Indiana State University are black, lined with blue satin with white satin chevrons. They are edged with velvet trimming of black to match the gown.

### Scholarship Honors

The student graduating with the highest scholarship index will be graduated summa cum laude. Students graduating with a scholarship index of 3.80 or higher will be graduated magna cum laude. Those with a scholarship index between 3.60 and 3.80 will be graduated cum laude. These achievements are set forth on the individual diplomas. Honor students can be recognized in the commencement exercises by the colored stoles and tassels. Gold indicates summa cum laude; red, magna cum laude; and blue, cum laude.
