William Zinsser is Commencement Speaker

Today the Commencement Address will be delivered by William Zinsser, an acclaimed writer, editor, and teacher.

Although expected to follow his father in the shellac-manufacturing business founded by his grandfather, Mr. Zinsser knew at an early age that he wanted to write. Both of his parents played important roles in his success as a writer. His optimism, sense of humor, and love of the literary world are gifts from his mother; from his father in the world of business, Mr. Zinsser gained his penchant for perfection and a "bone-deep belief that quality is its own reward."

A native of New York, Mr. Zinsser was educated at Deerfield Academy and Princeton University, which granted him a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1944. During World War II, he served in North Africa and Italy (1943-1945) and achieved the rank of sergeant in the United States Army.

He began his writing career in 1946 at the New York *Herald Tribune*, a newspaper with writers known for their warmth, humor, and humanity. Though Mr. Zinsser began as a feature writer, in his thirteen years on the *Herald Tribune*, he became drama editor, then film critic, and finally editorial writer before leaving to become a full-time free-lance writer. Since 1959, Mr. Zinsser has written regularly for leading magazines including *The New Yorker* and *The Atlantic*; from 1968 to 1972, he wrote a column for *Life* magazine. During the 1970s, Mr. Zinsser was on the faculty of Yale University, teaching nonfiction writing and humor writing, and serving as master of Branford College. He now is general editor of the Book-of-the-Month Club and consults on writing to schools, colleges, newspapers, and corporations. In 1984, Mr. Zinsser was a member of the Ohio River Writers' Conference faculty.

Mr. Zinsser is the author of eleven books. Two of his most recent works are Writing with a Word Processor and Willie and Dwike: An American Profile, a portrait of jazz musicians Willie Ruff and Dwike Mitchell. The third edition of his classic book, On Writing Well, was published this spring; this text is used in colleges and universities nationwide. In all of his writing and his teaching, Mr. Zinsser points to four cardinal virtues of good writing—clarity, economy, simplicity, and warmth.

In recognition of his work as a guardian of our language and his inestimable contributions to teaching the craft of writing, William Zinsser will receive the honorary Doctor of Letters degree in today's ceremony.

University Will Recognize Two Dental Education Leaders

Two men being honored in today's Commencement ceremony have contributed their time and expertise to establishing the foundation for excellence that is the mark of the allied health program at the University.

Dr. John Moore Bryan, who devoted six years to the University program aftel retiring from an Evansville dental practice, will be awarded the honorary Doctor of Science degree.

Dr. Ralph E. McDonald, dean of the Indiana University School of Dentistry for 17 of his nearly 40 years with the School, will receive the honorary Doctor of Laws degree.

An Evansville native, Dr. Bryan practiced dentistry for more than 47 years before retiring in June 1978. A few months later, he volunteered his expertise to the dental assisting and dental hygiene programs at the University. For six years thereafter, he served on the division's advisory committee and became the clinical dentist-in-residence. In that capacity, he often was called upon to teach, give counsel, and provide administrative leadership.

With his wife Virginia, Dr. Bryan also volunteered his expertise to a group called Holidays for Humanity, which in 1967 organized trips to Central America to treat the poor. They paid for their own supplies, equipment, and transportation in their several month-long stays in the mountains of Honduras and Guatemala. For his work with this group, Dr. Bryan received national recognition from the American Dental Association.

Dr. Bryan attended the University of Evansville and the Chicago College of Dental Surgery, the dental department of Loyola University. He received his Doctor of Dental Science degree in June 1930 and returned to Evansville and the unique experience of maintaining a dental practice with his twin brother, Dr. J. D. Bryan.

Dean McDonald helped develop the statewide program of dental auxiliary education which now operates at Indiana State University Evansille and in Indianapolis, Fort Wayne, Gary, and South Bend. He is a leader in his specialty of pedodontics and in other professional organizations here and abroad. Dean McDonald has been president of several of these organizations, including the American Society of Dentistry for Children which presented him with its Distinguished Service Award.

Dr. McDonald has lectured extensively in North and South America, Europe, and Asia, and has written or been co-author of numerous scientific articles. He now is editor of the journal, Pediatric Dentistry. Dean McDonald is a fellow of the American College of Dentistry and the International College of Dentists, an honorary member and correspondent of the Brazilian Academy of Dentistry, and an honorary member of the American Dental Society of Europe and the Irish Dental Association.

A native of Indianapolis, Dean McDonald received his Doctor of Dental Science degree and two other degrees from Indiana University. He was an officer with the U.S. Navy Dental Corps during World War II. Dr. McDonald and his wife Sara Jane have two sons who are dentists, and a daughter who is a dental hygienist.

Academic Dress

The academic costume dates from medieval days when university students wore woolen and fur garments for warmth in damp and drafty buildings. Most of those studying were clerics in the holy orders; they wore a cloak to which was attached a hood that could be pulled up to cover their tonsured heads. Simplified today, the costume serves to remind us that its wearer is a member of an ancient and venerable profession; it also indicates by its color and design its wearer's degree and its institution by which the degree was conferred.

In the United States, black has been the traditional color for academic gowns, but some institutions authorize holders of their doctorates to wear colors of the institution. The bachelor's gown is distinguished by its

long, open sleeves; the master's by its closed, slitted sleeves; the doctor's by its full sleeves trimmed with bands of velvet, which may be black or a color denoting the field in which the degree was taken.

The mortarboard cap, proper for all degrees, is black. Tassels, usually black, are worn over the left front quarter of the cap. Holders of the doctorate may wear

tassels of gold thread.

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. The honorary doctoral hoods of Indiana State University are black, lined with blue satin with white satin chevrons. They are edged with velvet trimming of black to match the gown.

The Mace of the University

In medieval England, the mace was a formidable weapon, held ready by a bodyguard who led the way for dignitaries or officers of the court. From the sixteenth century in England and since colonial days in America, the mace has become a symbol of office only, and is carried by a distinguished member of the faculty who leads the Commencement processional. Here, it is carried by the Grand Marshal.

The University's offical Mace is the cane of Richard Owen, who was a geologist and professor of natural science at Indiana University before becoming the first president of Purdue University. A respected scientist and scholar, Richard was a son of Robert Owen, the Scottish industrialist who established New Harmony, Indiana as a center for education and enlightened social reform in the early 1800s. All the children of Robert Owen who accompanied him to America made far-reaching contributions to society, and helped to shape the governmental, social, and cultural directions of the state, region, and nation.

Scholarship Honors

The student graduating with the highest scholarship index will be graduated summa cum laude. Students graduating with a scholarship index of 3.80 or higher will be graduated magna cum laude. Those with a scholarship index between 3.60 and 3.80 will be graduated cum laude. These achievements are set forth on the individual diplomas. Honor students can be recognized in the commencement exercises by the colored stoles and tassels. Gold indicates summa cum laude; red, magna cum laude; and blue, cum laude. The honor stoles and tassels are furnished by the ISUE Alumni Association.
