

CONGRESSMAN LEE H. HAMILTON WILL BRING COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS



United States Representative Lee H. Hamilton, a former Evansville resident who is senior member of Indiana's Congressional delegation, will bring the address of the University's nineteenth Commencement. Congressman Hamilton, Indiana's Ninth District Congressman since 1965, will be awarded an honorary Doctor of Civil Law degree in recognition of his many achievements in public service.

Mr. Hamilton has achieved a distinguished record in Congress, particularly on Constitutional issues. He is the ranking member of the Committee on Foreign Affairs and chairman of its Subcommittee on Europe and the Middle

East. Congressman Hamilton gained national acclaim last year with his able chairmanship of the Select Committee to Investigate Covert Arms Transactions with Iran.

In the Congress, Representative Hamilton also is chairman of the Joint Economic Committee and its Subcommittee on Economic Goals and Intergovernmental Policy; a member of the Committee on Science, Space, and Technology; former chairman of the Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence; former member of the Post Office and Civil Service Committee and Standards of Official Conduct Committee; and vice president of the Congressional Delegation to the U. S. Group of the Interparliamentary Union.

Congressman Hamilton, who lived in Evansville while his father was pastor of Trinity Methodist Church, was graduated in 1948 from Central High School. An outstanding basketball player, he received the 1948 Trester Award, and in 1982, was inducted into the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame. Congressman Hamilton was graduated with honors from DePauw University, attended Goethe University in Frankfurt, Germany, and received a Juris Doctor degree from Indiana University School of Law.

Congressman Hamilton and his wife, the former Nancy Ann Nelson, have three children. His honors have included the Central Intelligence Agency Medallion (1988); Defense Intelligence Agency Medallion (1987); DePauw University McNaughton Medal for Public Service (1987); Grand Cross of the Order of Merit of the Federal Republic of Germany (1985); Knight of the French Legion of Honor (1984); and the DePauw University Outstanding Senior (1952).

MRS. CAROLYN GEORGETTE HONORED FOR SERVICE TO UNIVERSITY, COMMUNITY

Mrs. Carolyn S. Georgette, manager of residence services in Evansville for Indiana Bell Telephone Company, will receive a Doctor of Laws degree in recognition of her service to the community and the University.


Mrs. Georgette is a business and civic leader who has shared her managerial skills with numerous nonprofit organizations in the community. She was a member of the Board of Incorporators for an Independent State University in Southwestern Indiana, which guided the establishment of the University of Southern Indiana, and remains a member of the Southern Indiana Higher Education, Inc., board.



An Evansville native, Mrs. Georgette joined Indiana Bell in 1954 as a teller and advanced to the top managerial post in Evansville. She has been a board member and president of the Metropolitan Evansville Chamber of Commerce, United Way, and Junior Achievement of Southwestern Indiana, and a member of the board of St. Mary's Medical Center Foundation. Mrs. Georgette was chairman of the Center City Development Committee which helped to create Evansville's Downtown master plan and also was a member of the Evansville Progress Committee.

Mrs. Georgette is a 1953 graduate of Reitz High School and attended Lockyear's Business College. She was a member of the board of ANEW (A Network of Evansville Women) from 1981 to 1988 and received its first annual ANEW Achievement Award. Other honors have included the prestigious Indiana Jefferson Award (1986); Iota Sigma Chapter, Delta Sigma Pi Award for Professionalism in Community and Commerce (1985); the Salvation Army's "Others Award" in 1984; and the American Business Women's Association "Woman of the Year" award.

D. MEAD JOHNSON RECOGNIZED FOR SUPPORT OF EDUCATION



Mr. D. Mead Johnson, former president and chairman of the board of Mead Johnson & Company, will be honored with the conferral of a Doctor of Laws degree in recognition of his achievements in business and his prominent role in bringing higher education to southern Indiana.

Mr. Johnson was with the Evansville company founded by his grandfather, Edward Mead Johnson, Sr., for more than 30 years, joining the company in 1936 as a sales representative in New York City. He came into the home office in 1938, and was named a director. In 1949, Mr. Johnson was named vice president for sales and advertising and held other vice

presidencies prior to being elected president on April 7, 1955. Under his leadership, Mead Johnson & Company engaged in an intensive pharmaceutical research and product development effort, achieving a significant presence as an innovative producer of unique and life-strengthening medicines.

In the early 1960s, Mr. Johnson recognized that access to public higher education was a necessary component of community progress, and urged Indiana higher education officials to bring public programs to Evansville. Active in civic affairs, Mr. Johnson also encouraged a spirit of voluntarism among his employees which has aided the community for many years.

Mr. Johnson moved to Palm Beach, Florida, in 1968 and lives there in retirement. He has been a director of Indiana Bell Telephone Company and the Mutual of Omaha and United of Omaha Insurance companies, and a member of the Board of Directors of Johns Hopkins University. He was an honor graduate of Tennessee Military Institute and Johns Hopkins University and was elected to Omicron Delta Kappa national honorary. He also received the Carlyle Barton Award as an outstanding college student.

Academic Dress

The academic costume dates from medieval days when university students wore woolen and fur garments for warmth in damp and drafty buildings. Most of those studying were clerics in the holy orders; they wore a cloak to which was attached a hood that could be pulled up to cover their tonsured heads. Simplified today, the costume serves to remind us that its wearer is a member of an ancient and venerable profession; it also indicates by its color and design its wearer's degree and its institution by which the degree was conferred.

In the United States, black has been the traditional color for academic gowns, but some institutions authorize holders of their doctorates to wear colors of the institution. The bachelor's gown is distinguished by its long, open sleeves; the master's by its closed, slitted sleeves; the doctor's by its full sleeves trimmed with bands of velvet, which may be black or a color denoting the field in which the degree was taken.

The mortarboard cap, proper for all degrees, is black. Tassels, usually black, are worn over the left front quarter of the cap. Holders of the doctorate may wear tassels of gold thread.

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. The honorary doctoral hoods of the University of Southern Indiana are black, lined with blue satin with red satin chevrons. They are edged with white velvet.

The Mace of the University

In medieval England, the mace was a formidable weapon, held ready by a bodyguard who led the way for dignitaries or officers of the court. From the sixteenth century in England and since colonial days in America, the mace has become a symbol of office only, and is carried by a distinguished member of the faculty who leads the Commencement processional. Here, it is carried by the Grand Marshal.

The University's official Mace is the cane of Richard Owen, who was a geologist and professor of natural science at Indiana University before becoming the first president of Purdue University. A respected scientist and scholar, Richard was a son of Robert Owen, the Scottish industrialist who established New Harmony, Indiana, as a center for education and enlightened social reform in the early 1800s. All the children of Robert Owen who accompanied him to America made far-reaching contributions to society, and helped to shape the governmental, social, and cultural directions of the state, region, and nation.

Scholarship Honors

The student graduating with the highest scholarship index will be graduated summa cum laude. Students graduating with a scholarship index of 3.80 or higher will be graduated magna cum laude. Those with a scholarship index between 3.60 and 3.80 will be graduated cum laude. These achievements are set forth on the individual diplomas. Honor students can be recognized in the Commencement Exercises by the colored stoles and tassels. Gold indicates summa cum laude; red, magna cum laude; and blue, cum laude.
