STEPHEN C. ZEHR TO DELIVER COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS



Stephen C. Zehr



Dr. Stephen C. Zehr, professor of sociology, is the 2017 recipient of the Distinguished Professor Award and will deliver the Commencement Address for the Romain College of Business and College of Liberal Arts Ceremony. He is being honored for his research, service and teaching in the fields of sociology and science and technology studies.

Zehr began his career at USI in 1994 as assistant professor of sociology. In 1997, he became associate professor of sociology and, in 2006, professor of sociology. He has served as chair of the Sociology Department and as interim director of the Master of Arts in Liberal Studies Program.

While at USI, Zehr has served on 38 University, college or department committees, of which he chaired 10. He has served in a variety of administrative roles or memberships with national and international professional organizations including the American Sociological Association, Society for Social Studies of Science (4S), and U.S. National Science Foundation (NSF). Most notably, he was appointed secretary for 4S and program officer and interim expert for the NSF Program in Science, Technology and Society.

In all, Zehr has secured seven grants including two NSF grants; published 13 articles and book chapters, five book reviews, and edited three syllabi collections; and reviewed research manuscripts and grant proposals for 22 scientific journals and funding agencies. He also has served on numerous NSF panels and site review teams. Zehr's research addresses questions on how scientific expertise is constructed in environmental controversies as they are represented in the media and policy deliberations.

Zehr graduated *magna cum laude* from State University College of New York at Potsdam in 1981 and, in 1990, completed a doctorate in sociology with a minor in the history and philosophy of science from Indiana University.

Prior to USI, Zehr was a visiting assistant professor of sociology at Union College in Schenectady, New York, and assistant professor of sociology at Illinois Institute of Technology in Chicago, Illinois.

The Distinguished Professor Award was established in 1983 and is given in recognition of significant achievement in teaching, scholarship and service. As a recipient, Zehr will receive a \$15,000 stipend underwritten by generous donors to the USI Foundation.

ROBERT MILLARD-MENDEZ TO DELIVER COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS



Robert Millard-Mendez



r. Robert Millard-Mendez, professor of art in the Art and Design Department, is the 2017 recipient of the H. Lee Cooper Core Curriculum Teaching Award and will deliver the Commencement Address for the College of Nursing and Health Professions and Pott College of Science, Engineering, and Education Ceremony. He is being honored for his embodiment of creative instruction in teaching students how to be more creative themselves.

Millard-Mendez began his career at USI in 2006 as assistant professor of art. He became associate professor in 2011 and full professor in 2017. He was assistant chair of the Art and Design Department from 2010-2013 before holding the chair position in the 2016-2017 academic year.

Graduating *summa cum laude* from the University of Massachusetts Lowell, Millard-Mendez received a bachelor's degree in sculpture in 1994, and a Master of Fine Arts in Sculpture from the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth in 1999.

He has been praised by students and faculty for his ability to instruct students in introductory core courses to produce art works that are so well crafted they are accepted into art shows juried by outside professionals. Many of these students are non-art majors who are completing a core course required for graduation.

Millard-Mendez's compassion and genuine care for his students is apparent by the way he walks the line between being there for them when they need him, and pushing them to work independently to find their own creative vision. He has been witnessed working with students by recognizing their fears, sympathizing with their worries, and working with them to step out of their comfort zones and take risks.

In addition to his willingness to serve the core curriculum by developing courses for the core, Millard-Mendez also creates his own award-winning works of art. He has been honored locally and nationally for his works, and has exhibited his work in museums and galleries across the country.

The H. Lee Cooper Core Curriculum Teaching Award was established in 2000 and honors a USI faculty member whose work in University Core Courses (UCC) has been especially creative and successful in furthering UCC goals. As a recipient, Millard-Mendez will receive a \$10,000 stipend underwritten by longtime and generous University friends, Ann and H. Lee Cooper III.

University of Southern Indiana: Knowledge for Life



President Linda L. M. Bennett became the third president of the University of Southern Indiana in 2009. In her inaugural address, she referenced the University's founding in 1965 and said, "Service to a greater good was a primary reason the University of Southern Indiana was created. It is our touchstone, and years after our founding and emergence as a separate state University, there is little doubt that USI is delivering on the promise of its founding."

From its earliest stage of planning in the early 1960s, community leaders have supported the University by providing a solid base for its present success and future growth. Local leaders worked with members of the Indiana General Assembly and governor's office to establish a public higher education campus. For the last 50 years, the University has continued to uphold its mission under the strong leadership of its first two presidents, David L. Rice and H. Ray Hoops, and now Bennett.

The University of Southern Indiana began on September 15, 1965, in the old Centennial School Building, offering classes to 412 students. In 1967 Southern Indiana Higher Education, Inc. (SIHE) raised nearly \$1 million to acquire the land where the campus now sits. Groundbreaking for the campus was held on June 22, 1968, and the University moved to its present site four miles west of the city limits of Evansville in September 1969, graduated its first class of baccalaureate degree students in 1971, and achieved initial North Central Association accreditation in 1974.

USI Today

USI enrolls more than 11,000 undergraduate, dual credit and graduate students in more than 100 areas of study. A public higher education institution located on a beautiful 1,400-acre campus in Evansville, Indiana, USI offers programs through the Romain College of Business, College of Liberal Arts, College of Nursing and Health Professions and the Pott College of Science, Engineering, and Education.

USI is a Carnegie Foundation Community Engaged University and offers continuing education and special programs to more than 16,000 participants annually though Outreach and Engagement. The University offers study-abroad opportunities in many countries and is host to international students from around the globe.

Outreach projects include the administration of Historic New Harmony, New Harmony Theatre, Historic Southern Indiana, New Harmony Gallery of Contemporary Art, Center for Communal Studies, Epi-Hab Center for Disability Studies and the Southern Indiana Japanese School, among others.

A competitive member of NCAA Division II and the Great Lakes Valley Conference, USI offers 17 varsity intercollegiate men's and women's sports.

Under the leadership of President Bennett, the University continues a tradition of affordable excellence through innovation and engagement, and positions USI as a top choice for high-caliber college students across the state, nationally and internationally.

The University of Southern Indiana has embarked on its second strategic plan. The first five-year strategic plan concluded in 2015. The 2016-2020 strategic plan includes three overarching goals:

- \cdot Excellence in Learning for the Entire USI Community
- · Access and Opportunity by Design
- \cdot Purposeful and Sustainable Growth

These three goals will frame the University's strategies as it moves forward.

Today, more than 40,500 alumni have been awarded diplomas from the University of Southern Indiana. USI graduates are renowned surgeons, bank executives, artists, leaders in K-12 education, accounting executives, lawyers, nurses, hospital administrators, college professors and elected officials—and they are involved in their communities.

Presidential Medallion

During the Middle Ages, medallions signified membership in religious orders and guilds; in the Renaissance, membership in elite orders of knighthood and prominence in government office. Today, colleges and universities strike medallions to commemorate important events and achievements. Donated by the late Melvin Denner, professor emeritus of biology, and Anne Denner, former instructor in nutrition and biology, and their family, this medallion was fabricated by Honorcraft for the 1995 inauguration of USI President H. Ray Hoops. Dr. Denner served as grand marshal at the University's first inauguration.

The University of Southern Indiana Presidential Medallion signifies the authority invested in the president.

The medallion's obverse carries, at its center, a three-inch reproduction of the University seal and, surrounding the seal, a half-inch rim. On the reverse appear the names and dates of appointment for the University's presidents. The president wears this medallion for all formal academic ceremonies.

Gonfalons

Ceremonial flags called gonfalons originated in the Middle Ages for civil and military processions, often appearing beneath the steel head of a knight's lance.

In Italy, gonfalons designated individual Italian republics; the chief magistrate, or other high official, served as gonfalonier carrying the banner.

At the University of Southern Indiana, gonfalons represent each major academic unit; typically deans or department heads act as gonfaloniers. Here gonfalon colors derive from traditional hues associated with each college's academic disciplines. Our Commencement gonfalons came as a gift from the USI Campus Store.

University Seal

The University Seal, designed by Nussmeier Engraving, bears the University's colors—red, white and blue with gold. The shield signifies the importance of higher education in defending citizens against ignorance.

Between the two banners displaying the University's name appear a band and an open book, bound together by the torch of knowledge. In the band, rays of light emanate simultaneously from a rising sun, symbolizing the young University and, from the torch, symbolizing the light of knowledge and the passion for scholarship. Trees on either side of the flame suggest not only the University's pastoral Southern Indiana setting but also life, growth and continuity.

Beneath this band, an open book emphasizes the importance of teaching and learning; *academia populi* and *academia populo* indicate that the University of Southern Indiana is a scholarly academy founded and supported by *the people*, *for the people*. Finally, the laurel branches to the right and left of the book represent victory: the light of learning overcomes the darkness of ignorance.

University Mace

In the Middle Ages, bodyguards of French and English monarchs carried ceremonial maces. Later, the mace became an important symbol of office in civil processions and academic pageantry. At the University of Southern Indiana, the grand marshal, a distinguished member of the faculty, carries the mace.

A replica of Richard Owen's walking cane serves as the staff for the University Mace. A respected geologist and professor of natural science at Indiana University, Owen was the first president of Purdue University. He was a son of Robert Owen, the Welsh industrialist who established New Harmony, Indiana, as a center for education and enlightened social reform in the early 1800s. The 32-inch tall wooden cane was presented to Richard Owen in 1874. Through the generosity of his descendant, the late Kenneth D. Owen, that cane, lent to USI, served as the grand marshal's staff in all Commencement exercises from 1985 to 1995.

Designed and fabricated by Nicholas Logsdon of Indianapolis, the gold-plated mace bears at the top, above the cane's golden head, an open orb with a replica of the University Seal.

The orb's free-flowing design symbolizes interrelationships among all academic disciplines. Immediately below the cane's orb, three two-inch, golden rings bear the names and appointment dates of the University presidents. The names of Kenneth Dale Owen, Jane Blaffer Owen and James A. Sanders, donors of the mace, appear on a finial near the bottom of the cane replica.

Designed and created by alumnus Kenny Fisher '77, the replica of the cane and its base are made of walnut from the Owen mansion built in New Harmony during the 1830s.

Academic Regalia

The academic costume dates from medieval days when university students wore woolen and fur garments for warmth in damp and drafty buildings. Most of those studying were clerics in holy orders; they wore a cloak to which was attached a hood that could be pulled up to cover their tonsured heads.

Simplified today, the costume serves to remind us that its wearer is a member of an ancient and venerable profession; it also indicates, by its color and design, the wearer's degree and the institution by which the degree was conferred.

In the United States, black has been the traditional color for academic gowns, but some institutions authorize holders of their doctorates to wear colors of the institution. The bachelor's gown is distinguished by its long, open sleeves; the master's by its closed, slitted sleeves; the doctor's by its full sleeves trimmed with bands of velvet, which may be black or a color denoting the field in which the degree was taken.

The mortarboard cap, proper for all degrees, is black. Tassels, usually black, are worn over the left front quarter of the cap. Holders of the doctorate may wear tassels of gold thread.

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree attained and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. The honorary doctoral hoods of the University of Southern Indiana are black, lined with blue satin with red satin chevrons. They are edged with white velvet. Retired members of the University faculty can be recognized in today's ceremony by the red, white and blue cords or a replica of the Presidential Medallion with a blue ribbon worn with their regalia.

The Distinguished Professor Award is the highest recognition bestowed upon a faculty member at the University of Southern Indiana. Faculty who have received this award can be recognized in today's ceremony by the blue and red stole embroidered with the University Seal worn with their regalia.

Hooding Ceremony

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree attained and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. Hooding signifies the induction of the graduate into the fellowship of the academy, a welcoming gesture by those who represent the high standards of scholarship and creative achievement.

Doctoral and master's degree candidates will receive hoods distinctive to their degrees.

Baccalaureate Scholarship Honors

The baccalaureate degree candidate graduating with the highest scholarship index graduates *summa cum laude*. Baccalaureate students graduating with a scholarship index of 3.80 or higher graduate *magna cum laude*. Those with a scholarship index between 3.60 and 3.80 graduate *cum laude*. These achievements are set forth on the individual diplomas. Honor students can be recognized in the Commencement exercises by colored stoles and tassels. Gold indicates *summa cum laude*, red, *magna cum laude*; and blue, *cum laude*.

Because students enrolled in doctoral and master's degree programs are expected to maintain a minimum grade point average of 3.0, and most achieve much higher levels, scholarship honors at Commencement are given only to baccalaureate students.

University Honors Scholars

The designation of University Honors Scholar is awarded to students who successfully complete the Honors Program. They can be recognized in the Commencement ceremony by the white honor cords worn with their regalia.

Alumni Association Pins

Graduates in each ceremony are receiving alumni lapel pins with the University logo as a gift from the University of Southern Indiana Alumni Association. The Alumni Association was organized with the first graduating class in 1971.

Photography During Ceremony

A commercial photographer will take a photo of each graduate as the diploma is presented on stage. A second photograph will be taken as the graduate departs from the stage. Graduates will receive proofs of the photos from which duplicates can be ordered. Family members who wish to take still or video photographs during the ceremony may do so from their seats. Your cooperation ensures the dignity of the Commencement ceremony.
