


Key Benefits of Interprofessional Education (IPE)



Curriculum Integration

- Began activity in 2009 with Respiratory Therapy,
 Radiology, Nursing, and Occupational Therapy
- In 2016, College received first ever NEXUS award from the National Center for Interprofessional Practice and Education based on IPE work funded through a \$1.2 million HRSA grant in in 2014
- American Interprofessional Health Collaborative faculty serve as IPE mentors across the country
- Collaborating Across Borders faculty presentations


