University Confers Honorary Doctorate Degree on Dean Emerita Nadine Coudret

The University recognized the singular achievement of the founding dean of the USI College of Nursing and Health Professions during the May 2022 Commencement Exercises. Dr. Nadine Coudret, Dean Emerita of College of Nursing and Health Professions and Professor Emerita of Nursing, who also served as interim University Provost for a year, received an honorary Doctor of Laws degree.

She joined USI in 1988 with the charge to develop an academic program in nursing. Twentyfour years later, at her retirement in 2012, the program was conferring bachelor, master and doctoral degrees in nursing; programs in diagnostic sonography and nutrition; and had elevated dental hygiene from an associate degree program to Indiana's first baccalaureate program in the field.

In her formal citation at Commencement, it was noted that under her leadership, over 6,500 students had graduated from the College of Nursing and Health Professions and she had assisted in bringing approximately \$10 million in awards and external grants to her programs. The degree conferral also noted her outstanding community service on many local, state, and national boards. Graduates of USI Nursing and Health Professions programs consistently rank at the top of professional standards examinations.

Aloha from Hawaii!

Dr. Charles Petranek, Professor Emeritus of Sociology, moved with his wife Diana to Honolulu, Hawaii, when he retired. He is teaching Introduction to Sociology and an internship course at the University of Hawaii, and reports that it was difficult during the COVID pandemic.

Some may remember that he had summer and academic sabbatical sojourns to Hawaii while he was teaching at USI. In observing USI's move to Division I athletics, he reported that University of Hawaii is the national champion in Men's Volleyball.

CARL AND LORI SAXBY TELL ABOUT EXPLORING NATIONAL PARKS

We enjoy learning about American history, seeing beautiful and unique sights and being outdoors. The National Park Service sites are an expertly curated mix of these things. The Park Service manages 423 historic sights, national monuments, battlefields and other designations, but only 51 of these sites are national parks within the continental United States. To date, we have visited 37 national parks and scores of other Park Service sites. Most of the continental parks yet to be visited are in the Pacific northwest, southern California, plus Big Bend in Texas. We have trips planned to explore these areas.

One organized means of uncovering parks and historic sites is a themed trip. For example, we retraced the Oregon Trail from Independence Missouri to what is now suburban Portland, Oregon and then followed the California Trail home. Side trips along the route included Promontory Point, Utah, Craters of the Moon, Idaho, several Lewis and Clark related sites and many more scenic or historically significant preservations we encountered along the way. Thematic trips offer something new and different every day with each uniquely tailored to one's curiosity.

There are 12 National Parks outside of continental United States: eight in Alaska, two in Hawaii, and one each in American Samoa and the Virgin Islands. Most, but not all, of these parks are very remote and difficult to visit. It's unlikely that we will dive the coral reefs of American Samoa or trek the mountains of Gates of the Artic in Alaska as examples, but, maybe?
