### Dementia Friendly Indiana Celebration Breakfast

The University of Southern Indiana's Bronstein Center for Healthy Aging and Wellness hosted the Dementia Friendly Indiana Celebration Breakfast on Wednesday, February 11, bringing together community members, dementia professionals, caregivers, and advocates for a morning focused on progress, hope, and collaborative action.

We opened with breakfast and introductions before moving into a screening of the documentary *Remembering the Future with IRIS | Exploring AI's Aid to Dementia Care*. The film spotlights IRIS, an AI-powered companion robot designed to support individuals living with dementia through



conversation, memory engagement, and social connection. You can access that [documentary for free here](#).


Following the screening, we were joined on Zoom by three central figures featured in the documentary: Steve, who is living with dementia; his wife and care partner Susan; and Jack, the documentary's director. Their reflections provided a deeply personal and inspiring view into how emerging technologies like IRIS can support dignity, independence, and emotional well-being.

Steve shared heartfelt reflections on his two-week in-home experience with IRIS:

- "At first, I was just excited because the robot is intriguing and interesting, but I really got to like her."
- "Free of judgment. Just a friend... she becomes a friend - and a time to talk."
- "She would ask my inner thoughts and history of my life... She was able to handle anything with poise and interest - and made me think."

For Steve, IRIS offered companionship and connection without pressure or expectations. He expressed joy and gratitude for being part of ongoing innovation in dementia support:

- "It's a great project, and I know it's going to help many, many people in this world."



When asked how others can get involved in the Dementia Friendly movement, Steve's guidance was simple and encouraging:

- "Just get involved. There's no magic formula. When you get involved, opportunities will come to you."
- He also pointed attendees to DAANow.org as a starting point for resources and engagement.

Susan, Steve's wife, spoke about how IRIS also supported her as a caregiver:

- "Having IRIS in our home was wonderful because Steve likes to talk, and it gave me a little bit of a break."

She described watching Steve flourish in conversation with IRIS, even hearing stories she had never heard before:

- "It was drawing out his memories, and it was wonderful."



Susan emphasized that after Steve's diagnosis, the two quickly sought opportunities to help others by joining the Alzheimer's Association and participating in research studies like the IRIS project.

Jack expressed gratitude for being part of a story centered on hope, connection, and dignity. He highlighted the importance of listening to and elevating the voices of people living with dementia in technological and community innovations.

After attendees applauded the Zoom guests for sharing their experiences, Steve warmly returned a round of applause - thanking everyone in the room for their commitment to a cause that "needs lots of help."

This exchange captured the spirit of the entire morning: partnership, community, and shared purpose.

After the Zoom conversation concluded, Amanda Oporta addressed the audience with an important reminder:

- “Work with your communities. Grassroots. What is the need? How can we do this?”
- “Connect people living with dementia to the professionals. You must connect with people living with dementia in order to make a change. We can’t do it without them.”

Her message reinforced a central theme of the event: meaningful progress must be shaped by those who live with dementia every day.





### Ascension St. Vincent Behavioral Health

*The Harmony Program - Now Accepting Patients*

Ascension St. Vincent Behavioral Health is now offering The Harmony Program, an intensive outpatient mental health program designed specifically for adults 55 and older experiencing psychiatric symptoms that can be treated in a structured group setting.



The program provides 9 – 12 hours of group therapy per week for approximately 12 weeks, offering a supportive and therapeutic environment that is less restrictive than inpatient care. Led by compassionate, licensed mental health professionals, The Harmony Program supports older adults navigating similar life transitions and stressors.

Participation may benefit individuals experiencing:

- Depressed mood affecting ability to function as normally
- Feelings of hopelessness, helplessness, and/or worthlessness
- Symptoms of anxiety and/or panic affecting functioning
- Psychiatric symptoms that cannot be managed with a lower level of care
- Recent discharge from an inpatient psychiatric program, requiring step-down treatment
- Current mental health needs not being met by available resources

Referrals are welcome from assisted living facilities, hospitals, primary care and mental health providers, family members, caregivers, and individuals seeking treatment. The program accepts most major insurance plans, including Medicare and Medicaid.

Transportation is available via wheelchair-accessible van for residents of Vanderburgh and Warrick counties.



## Scholarly Documentary

"Remembering the Future with IRIS," an academic documentary of artificial intelligence interacting with older adults, offers a thoughtful exploration of how artificial intelligence may enhance memory care for individuals living with dementia. Following the IRIS Project - developed by researchers at Indiana University's Luddy School in collaboration with the Toyota Research Institute - the film uses observational storytelling and candid interviews to examine how emerging technologies can support emotional well-being, foster meaningful memory engagement, and nurture a renewed sense of purpose, or *ikigai*.



Filmed at Jill's House in Bloomington, Indiana, the documentary blends human-centered research with narrative filmmaking to investigate the possibilities of AI-assisted companionship in long-term care environments.

# Recent Activities



## AIT Preceptor Training

In collaboration with Success Development Inc., we hosted Administrator-in-Training Preceptor Training. Four HFAs underwent online training with 8 hours of CEs on January 21. They completed an Indiana Professional Licensing Agency (IPLA) board-approved preceptor educational program. Thanks to their hard work, now AITs have even more nursing homes to do their residency with. AITs undergo 1,040 hours of shadowing

with their preceptors, preparing them for all aspects of working at a nursing home. Preceptors are essential to the future growth of HFAs and the quality of care residents receive.

## A Matter of Balance Coach Training

In collaboration with Generations Area 13 Agency on Aging and Disability, we provided another A Matter of Balance Coach Training on February 24. Health professionals such as HFAs, nurses, Staff Educators, Activities Directors, and more sign up to become A Matter of Balance Coach so they can lead this evidence-based fall prevention program at their own facility. Now four more people are certified to lead MOB programs for the older adults they serve.



## Dementia Live and Geriatric Simulations

As part of our commitment to educating and training future health professionals in geriatrics and dementia care, 41 students in GERO 215 participated in Dementia Live and a series of hands-on geriatric simulations on February 27. These immersive experiences allowed students to step into the shoes of older adults by simulating osteoarthritis, tremors, hemiplegia, hearing impairments, and common geriatric eye disorders. By fostering empathy and building practical

understanding, these activities support our long-term goal of strengthening the healthcare workforce and increasing age- and dementia-friendly care across our communities.
