HONOR FLIGHT EVV13

HonorFlight of Southern Indiana plans and executes the most heartfelt and compassionate day honoring our special veterans! October 29, 2022 will forever be etched in my memory as a special day spent with my 94-year-old father, Gearld E. Mourer, and 85 other deserving WWII, Korean War and Vietnam era veterans. We arrived at Evansville Regional Airport at 5 a.m., and as we pulled away from the terminal, the sun was peaking over the horizon. We were saluted with water cannons from the airport fire department. Landing at Dulles International Airport in Washington DC we were once again saluted with the water cannons! We later learned this was the highest honor given by the fire

department. It was very touching.

On the buses, a local tour guide gave background on each site we visited. At the World War II memorial, all the veterans were gathered for a group photo all holding a photo of themselves when they were in the service.

Dad and I spent time at both the South Pacific and Atlantic ends of the memorial and the Freedom Wall. There are 4,048 gold stars each representing 100 Americans who died in the war. The message in front reads: "Here we mark the price of freedom."

At the Korean War memorial, you see statues of 19 warriors from all branches of service are "on patrol" in the cold. The reflection of the 19 on the black wall, with etched faces of those soldiers who did not make it home, makes a total of 38 soldiers to represent the 38th parallel. A wall listing 36,000 names of Americans killed in Korea surrounds a Pool of Remembrance. The reverence with which visitors treat this memorial was impressive. At the Vietnam Wall, the quiet

reverence of the visitors at the memorial was poignant and an emotional experience.

The highlight of the trip was to witness the changing of the guard at Arlington National Cemetery as the guards march back and forth guarding our Unknown Soldiers from WWI, WWII and Korean War.

Back in Evansville, we were greeted by over 3,000 people, waving flags and holding signs to thank our veterans. If you know of a veteran from WWII, Korean War or Vietnam Era please have them go to HonorFlightSI.org and register to go on this flight. There is no cost to the Veteran. If you are interested, you can register to serve as a Guardian for a veteran.

Trip to Rome by Sherrianne Standley

On the other side of the world, we discovered we were not far from our USI and Indiana experience! It all began after our friend, The Honorable Joe Donnelly, former U.S. Senator from Indiana, became U.S. Ambassador to the Holy See (Vatican) in Rome. "Now is the time to visit," said Tony Goben, who managed Sen. Donnelly's southern Indiana Senate office; and Sarah Helming, who preceded Goben in that job, agreed. Off we went in mid-November, after the summer crowds and before the holiday rush.

Our hotel, two blocks from the Colosseum, was a perfect base for our 8:30 a.m. to 9 p.m. (walking 17,000-22,000 steps a day) excursions. Ambassador Donnelly and his staff advised on "must do" guided tours of the Vatican Museums and the Catacombs under St. Peter's Basilica. He warmly welcomed us to the Embassy, extending true Hoosier Hospitality. And then we encountered more reminders of home! As we toured the Vatican Museums, whose galleries contain a dazzling array of art and architecture, I stopped dead in my tracks when I recognized the Jacques Lipchitz scale model for "Between Heaven and Earth" (1958), his monumental sculpture that now defines the New Harmony Roofless Church.

Our last day, we visited the Basilica of the Holy Cross in Jerusalem, one of the Seven Pilgrim Churches of Rome. There we viewed actual relics of the Crucifixion, fragments of the cave of Bethlehem, and a replica of the Shroud of Turin, long studied by USI Professor Emeritus of History **Dan Scavone**. The church exhibit has a natural-sized copy of the Holy Shroud and the Holy Shroud crucifix, presented by the Archdiocese of Turin in 2002.

Throughout our visits to the multitude of ancient (think second and third century) churches and sacred places, museums, gardens, fountains, plazas, and carefully preserved archaeological sites, I recalled the touring advice of seasoned traveler and Professor Emerita of English and Humanities **Sherry Darrell** and I heard the Art History classroom voice of Art Professor Emerita **Hilary Braysmith**. In the Borghese Museum galleries, almost every famous historic painter and sculptor is represented. Throughout Rome, we marveled at the finest art, architecture, and archaeology in the world. And I loved remembering that we are never far away from our treasured USI family.

If you go: Most churches (all containing superb art) are free to tourists and open daily. You must "advance purchase" tickets for the Vatican Museums, the Catacombs, and the Borghese Museum, but the beautiful Borghese Garden is free. The inexpensive "hop on and hop off" Rome tour buses are a great way to get a global view of the city and visit your must-see places. Brush up on your Latin and your Roman numerals. Do not miss the Roman Ruins illuminated at night!
