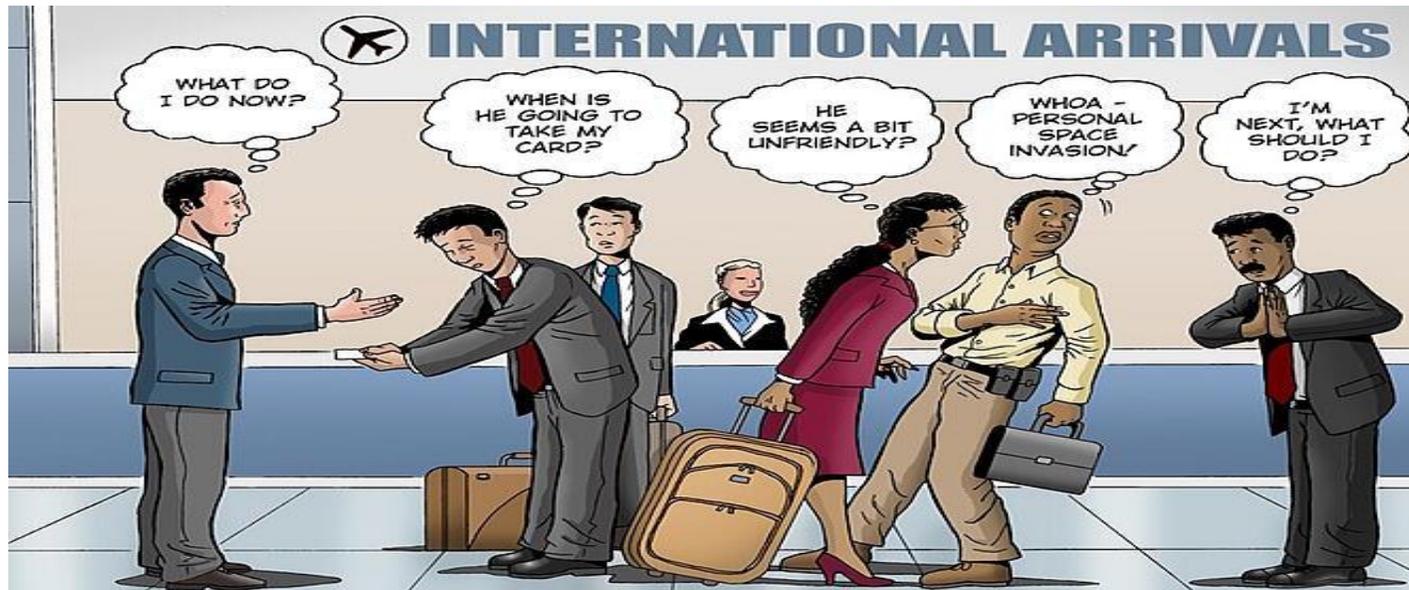
- What do you believe serves as the catalyst to the conflicts you have experienced in your respective roles?

# What Hinders Cross Cultural Communication?

- Assigning Stereotypes: this is best described as making general assumptions about a group of individuals based on your limited experiences
- Being ethnocentric/ethnocentrism: This is the inability whether directly or by proxy to accept the differences of others
- Discrimination: Whether intentionally or not, treating someone poorly, or in a way that negatively impacts their existence as individual, is discrimination

# Tips

- Listen and engage with the desire to learn and understand
- Avoid questions that may align with stereotypes associated with the individual you are engaging with
- Embrace the notion that communication is fluid
