Best Practices Tip #1 Assign Students to Groups

It Depends, But... Self-Selection is **NOT a Best Practice!**

- Groups require diverse backgrounds
- Self-Selection doesn't diversify groups
 - Similarity-Attraction from Psychology
- It's not the real world
- People are left out



Tip #1 (continued) Best Ways to Create Groups and Teams?

- Use a Transparent
 Process
 - Random
 - Criteria that randomizes
 - Form teams intentionally
- Then Start with a Team Charter

Best Practices Tip #2 Use Groupwork to Engage Students

- Think, Pair Share
- Group Discussion Questions
- Learning Thru Discussion (by <u>Hill</u>)
- Each One, Teach One (a peerlearning strategy)
- Run a Team Project



Best Practices Tip #3 Managing Group Conflict

- Set Objective Task Criteria
- Separate the People from the Problem
- Focus on the Goal & Shared Interests
- Generate Many Possible Ideas
- Ongoing Group Dialogue
 - Start, Stop, Continue

As a Last Resort: Get Involved!



Best Practices Tip #4: Evaluating Teamwork

- Start with the End in Sight
 - Think about your rubric
 - Share your rubric
- Incorporate Ongoing Feedback
- Decide on the Weighting
 - Peer vs Instructor?

Best Practices Tip #5 Improving Virtual Teamwork

- 1. Start teams with face-to face meetings
- 2. Schedule regular face-to-face meetings
- 3. Include extra work on teambuilding
- 4. Know your tools
- 5. Teach to the tools
- 6. Match the tool to the task
- 7. Remain organized
- 8. Appoint a leader who understands virtual work


