
## **USI Friends Attend Aakhus Art Exhibit**

Several Retirees and USI colleagues attended the opening reception for "Magical Realism: the Art of Michael Aakhus," the featured show in the annual Festival of Trees at the Owensboro (Kentucky) Museum of Fine Arts. The impressive exhibit treated visitors to 40 monumental paintings inspired by Aakhus' decades of world travel. A prominent scholar of the ancient art of Mesoamerica and South America, Aakhus' art is based on personal research and study of the cultures of those regions and characterized by vivid regional colors. Aakhus is Dean Emeritus of the College of Liberal Arts and Professor Emeritus of Fine Arts. His daughter Erin and her family attended, as did his partner Rob Stone.



# **USI Retirees Labhart and Mahoney Honored**

Two USI Retirees received honorary doctorate degrees, the highest form of recognition granted by the University, during December 2023 Commencement ceremonies.

Marjorie Olsen Labhart, Instructor Emerita in Mathematics, received an honorary Doctor of Science degree, and Timothy B. Mahoney, Instructor Emeritus of Economics, received an honorary Doctor of Business degree. They both were nominated by academic colleagues and alumni in their disciplines and approved by the Board of Trustees.

Each has more than four decades of service to USI; each helped build curriculum in their discipline; each reached beyond the classroom to broaden extracurricular opportunities for students; and each invested in programs such as scholarships, faculty enhancement and public engagement to enhance the University's mission.

Labhart was one of the earliest faculty members, joining then-ISUE on its first day of classes September 15, 1965, and teaching until 2008. She guided many first-generation students to a baccalaureate degree.

Mahoney came to USI in 1987 to lead a new Labor-Management Education Forum, which brought community leaders together to forge a fresh path for southern Indiana economic development. He was a popular economics professor and legendary student advisor. Though he retired in 2020, he continued to teach online courses through 2023.

## **Communal Studies Association 50th Anniversary Celebration**

In appreciation, the Communal Studies Association commissioned Katie Waters, Professor Emerita of Art, to create a painting of Don Pitzer's granddaughter, Harmony, at the Harmonist Labyrinth when she was a young child. Don Pitzer, Professor Emeritus of History, is the Founder and Director Emeritus of the Center for Communal Studies which fosters scholarly work about New Harmony and other communal societies.
