REPORTS FROM OFFICERS

Chair: Jake Hansen

Hansen reported attending the following meetings:

Board of Trustees- Special Meeting (2/7/2022) - USI Board of Trustees unanimously voted to approve the Application for reclassification to Division 1 for the 2022-2023 year.

Presidents Council (2/8/2022) - Vice President Strupp announced that on Wednesday, February 9 at 12pm USI will announce their conference partner in the USI Arena. President Rochon opened the floor for questions and comments about the reclassification to D1. Questioned posed by the body were about compensation, recruitment, extra work for staff and faculty, costs to students and full survey results being posted. In other discussion, USI will be interviewing candidates for the College of Nursing and Health Professions, Liberal Arts and Romain College of Business Deans in the coming weeks. Invitations to follow for those that will be involved. USI census data was presented. 7,157 Undergraduate Students are enrolled for Spring 2022, which is almost 82,000 credit hours. COVID19 numbers continue to decline on campus, this is due to our policies and practices. Aaron Trump is monitoring the Indiana Congress for the upcoming bills that are being motioned and passed. These bills will not necessarily influence USI directly but could change K-12 education.

Executive Team Meeting (2/8/2022) - Executive Team met to discuss the D1 announcement and moving forward. We also discussed the next steps with FlexWork.

COVID Taskforce (2/16/2022) - Masks must stay for USI to remain safe until after spring break. Student numbers are trending down as well as employees. Contract tracing could benefit from a more streamlined process. The taskforce agrees that home testing is augmenting the data in the region. Masks still make a difference with transmission.

Development Council Meeting (2/21/2022) - I have been invited to be part of the USI Development Council. This council is the beginning stages of the new capital campaign through the Foundation at USI. This meeting was to establish our committees and steering. VP Bower explained that we will gather our own committee and discuss the needs of our department, college, and program. A report will be due to the larger council on April 22, 2022.

Executive Team Meeting (2/23/2022) - Executive Team met to plan the agenda for this month's meeting.

COVID Taskforce (3/2/2022) - Taskforce met to discuss the current state of COVID19 in our region. Data was presented regarding Indiana Institutions going mask option this week. It is important that we follow the CDC guidance on Color and cases in a region. Currently, Vanderburgh is in orange, this report will be updated on Thursday this week. The consensus of the group is to stay the course with masks and distancing.

Stump reported that he was in several of the meetings Hansen was in and has nothing more to report from those meetings.

Secretary/Treasurer: Brandi Hess

Hess reported she submitted the paperwork for reimbursement from USI Foundation for printing costs incurred over the summer for the Nurturing Our Nest Initiative. Administrative Senate account balance is \$1,500 because even with the drink voucher costs, those will be reimbursed by USI Foundation as well.
